-Providing our children a strong Catholic upbringing.


-Giving comfort to those in need.


Mass Intentions Available

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, Peter and the Apostles are questioned and ordered by the Sanhedrin to stop teaching in Jesus' name. In the second reading, John has a vision of countless angels, living creatures, and elders crying out in praise to the Lamb of God. In the Gospel, Jesus appears at the sea to Peter and other disciples. Jesus instructs them to cast their net over the right side and they have a great catch of fish. Then he serves them breakfast, asks Peter three times if he loves him, and instructs Peter to feed his sheep and follow him.

III SUNDAY OF EASTER CALLED TO EXPERIENCE AND ANNOUNCE GOD'S LOVE

We are already in the third Sunday of Easter. And the readings make us reflect on the joy of evangelizing.

That is to say the commitment of living and transmitting the faith, not just passing on knowledge, but a faith lived out with joy.

"But Peter and the apostles said in reply, 'We must obey God rather than men. We are witnesses of these things, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him." (Acts 5:29.32) Today, as yesterday, there are many conflicts that arise between the Gospel and what we encounter, and as disciples, evangelizers and missionaries of Jesus we are invited to take the same position as the Apostles. But the Gospel does not oppose nor destroy any project that fosters the true humanization of people; but rather the opposite, it favors it. On April 6, 2002 Fr. Marcelo Pérez was ordained as a priest in a parish where I was the pastor. It is a community that is majority indigenous and Fr. Marcelo himself is indigenous from that same culture. Most on his parishes where he served has been heavily affected by alcoholism, drugs and impunity for the local authorities. Fr. Marcelo has denounced these in many ways, looking for the good of his people. That had meant that Fr. Marcelo have received many death threats, but he knows perfectly well that his mission is to spread the kingdom of God which humanizes and those threats do not stop him. On October 20, 2024, he was killed because he denounced injustices and seeking the good for his people.

Chapter 21 of the gospel of John, which is what we hear this Sunday, narrates three scenes: 1) the apostles decide to go fishing and Jesus appears to them, and the miraculous catch follows along with their recognition of him; 2) the dialogue between Jesus and Peter to whom he entrusts his mission as pastor of the Church; and 3) the destiny of Peter and **Jesus' beloved disciple.**

"Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We also will come with you.'" (Jn 21:2-3) The fact that seven of his disciples were together and invited by Peter to return to their activities in Galilee means that the impact of Jesus' death was too much. But the event where Jesus appears to them at the edge of the lake helps them to experience Christ, alive and present. This experience must be meditated on over and over, accepting the belief of the message as a personal and communal experience. Today is it necessary to announce a living Christ who comes out to meet mankind and offers them hope, and meaning for their lives, for our lives. Today our evangelization needs to come out from that experience, meditated upon and lived out in the Resurrected Christ.

"Jesus said to him the third time, 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, 'Do you love me?' and he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep."" (Jn 21:17) This is the triple confession of faith of Peter in Jesus. Salvation is an act of the love of God manifested in Jesus to the extreme, even unto death on a cross. Peter is chosen to make possible and present the prolongation of this act in the world. And so, he is asked about his capacity and willingness to love Jesus and through him and in him, all mankind. Carrying out the mission that was given him is only possible through these dispositions: complete surrender. This scripture passage coincides with our time of waiting for the conclave. In an interview by newspaper a cardinal was asked if they expected the next pope to continually of Pope Francis' mission? He replied that they are expected to next Pope be a successor of Peter, whose successor he is, not Pope Francis.

It is only possible to carry out this kind of pastoral love if one has experienced the profound love of God revealed in the person, life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Each Christian is called to experience this love of God in order to then be converted into an apostle of love. May we draw near to this font of love: the risen Christ.

Cardinals ask faithful to pray for their discernment for new Pope

The Holy See released a declaration on Wednesday in which the Cardinals preparing for the upcoming conclave ask the faithful to pray for them.

"The College of Cardinals gathered in Rome, engaged in the General Congregations in preparation for the Conclave, wishes to invite the People of God to live this ecclesial moment as an event of grace and spiritual discernment, listening to the will of God," read the statement.

The Cardinals said they feel "the need to be supported by the prayers of all the faithful," since they are aware of their responsibility in choosing the next Successor of Peter.

Prayer, they added, "is the true force that in the Church promotes the unity of all the members of the one Body of Christ."

"Faced with the enormity of the task ahead and the urgency of the present time," said the Cardinals, "it is first of all necessary to make ourselves humble instruments of the infinite wisdom and providence of our Heavenly Father, in docility to the action of the Holy Spirit."

The Cardinals noted that the Holy Spirit is "the protagonist of the life of the People of God, the One to whom we must listen, accepting what He is saying to the Church."

"May the Blessed Virgin Mary accompany these prayers with her maternal intercession," concluded the Cardinals' declaration.
